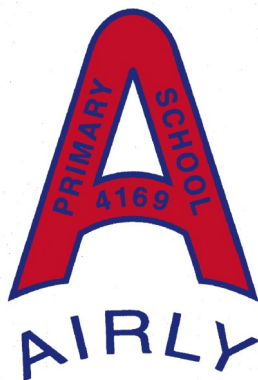

On Friday, March 22 students may ride from the Michies' front gate (8:45am) to school for Ride2School day. Parent helpers are required to ride bikes alongside or drive escort cars around our group of riders. Please see teachers if you can assist.

Reminders

*Students who arrive late to school need to be signed in by the person who delivers them to school. This is a requirement of our Emergency Plan that students are recorded as being at school.

*Excursion notes really need two phone contact numbers. Usually a parent is the first point of contact, but the emergency number needs to be different to this, just in case the parent does not answer.

*Students should bring their reader bag to school EVERY day. Books need to be changed, teachers want to read with students & often there are notices in the reader bags that need to be seen by parents. Teachers want to make sure a regular home reading routine exists by checking Reading Logs each day. Already we have some students who might only bring their reading bags once a fortnight. *Are these students reading at home in that time??*

*Lots of students seem to be bringing toys to school. We ask parents to please keep all toys at home. We have plenty of equipment and friends to play with at school that extra toys aren't needed.

National Day of Action Against Bullying & Violence

On Friday students will recognise National Day of Action Against Bullying & Violence. Our Grade 6 leaders will organise learning activities.

Premier's Reading Challenge
